



Dr. Albert Lilly

Dr. Albert Lilly holds a Bachelor of Music degree from DePauw University (Greencastle, IN), a Master of Music degree from Jordan College/Conservatory of Music at Butler University (Indianapolis, IN), and a Doctor of Music degree from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music (Bloomington, IN). He currently serves as the instructor of trumpet at Marian University (Indianapolis, IN), adjunct professor in the College of Adult and Graduate Studies at Indiana Wesleyan University (Marion, IN) and Assistant Director of Bands at Monrovia High School (Monrovia, IN). He works with more than 20 high school band programs throughout the country as arranger, consultant, or program coordinator. Bands he has directed or arranged for have won more than 15 state, circuit, or association titles, and literally hundreds of best music and best general effect awards. The Monrovia High School program is the only class D program in Indiana to win 9 ISSMA (Indiana State School Music Association) “All-Music” Awards, presented to the music programs that receive the gold rating in marching, solo and ensemble, jazz, and concert organizational contests. Dr. Lilly has been named numerous times as an honored educator for the Monrovia “Top 10” banquet, an event celebrating the top 10 percent of the graduating class and the teachers that have had the most positive influence on those scholars throughout their high school careers. Dr. Lilly previously worked with programs including those at Carmel High School (Carmel, IN) and Martinsville High School

(Martinsville, IN). He currently writes and arranges for several winter indoor percussion lines, and many have made state and circuit finals and won multiple state championships.

Dr. Lilly has been a member of the Central States Judges Association since 1996, and has served Music Caption Head since 2002. He has judged state or circuit finals in more than fifteen states. He was named the 2004 winner of the association's "Whatever It Takes" award, traditionally given to the member who has done the most above and beyond the call of duty for the association. In 2014, he was named as a member of the Central States Judges Association Hall of Fame, an honor reserved for the select few of CSJA who have done and given the most to the organization, to adjudication, and to the marching activity. Dr. Lilly has also served as music caption consultant for the Florida Marching Band Tournament. Dr. Lilly is a member of the artist-faculty for the National Trumpet Competition, and adjudicates state solo contest for ISSMA frequently. He also served ISSMA as a member of the brass listing revision committee, selecting new works for the state solo competition list. He also judges the indoor winter percussion activity for the Indiana Percussion Association and the Carolina Indoor Performance Association.

Dr. Lilly teaches private music lesson to more than 40 students, and adjudicates concert festivals and competitions for the Indiana State School Music Association, the Indiana Music Educators Association, and the Mid-States Band Association. As a trumpeter, Dr. Lilly has served at the principal trumpet of the Lafayette (IN) Symphony Orchestra, the Greencastle (IN) Chamber Orchestra, the Wabash College Chamber Symphony (Crawfordsville, IN), the Bach Chorale Chamber Orchestra (Lafayette, IN), the Indianapolis (IN) Philharmonic Orchestra, and the Bloomington (IN) Symphony Orchestra, and has a long list guest and substitute appearances with orchestras throughout the United States from San Francisco to New York, and many other locations. He currently serves as principal trumpet for the Hendricks Symphony Orchestra as part of the Hendricks Symphonic Society (Avon, IN). He has also performed as a guest soloist with many wind ensembles, jazz ensembles and

orchestras. His trumpet work can be heard on National Public Radio, ESPN, and CBS Records, in addition to his substantial commercials and jingles work in the Indianapolis, Greencastle, and Terre Haute (IN) radio and television markets. In addition to his trumpet work, Dr. Lilly is also an accomplished percussionist, and is a member of the Scholastic Educator Program with the Vic Firth Company.

Dr. Lilly is Calendar Editor for the International Trumpet Guild, and holds membership in the International Trumpet Guild, the Indiana Bandmasters' Association, the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP), the College Music Society, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Pi Kappa Lambda, and Pi Lambda Theta. Both the Chancellor's List and the National Dean's List have honored him for his superb work in music scholarship and research. He has served on the Board of Directors of the Musical Arts Youth Orchestra (Bloomington, IN) for four years, and the Bloomington Symphony Orchestra (Bloomington, IN) for two years. He is a Master Mason and a member of F. & A.M. Lodge #103 in Dayton, IN. Dr. Lilly lives on the family farm near Martinsville, IN with his wife Vicki, their Bichon Frisès, Abe and Josie.
